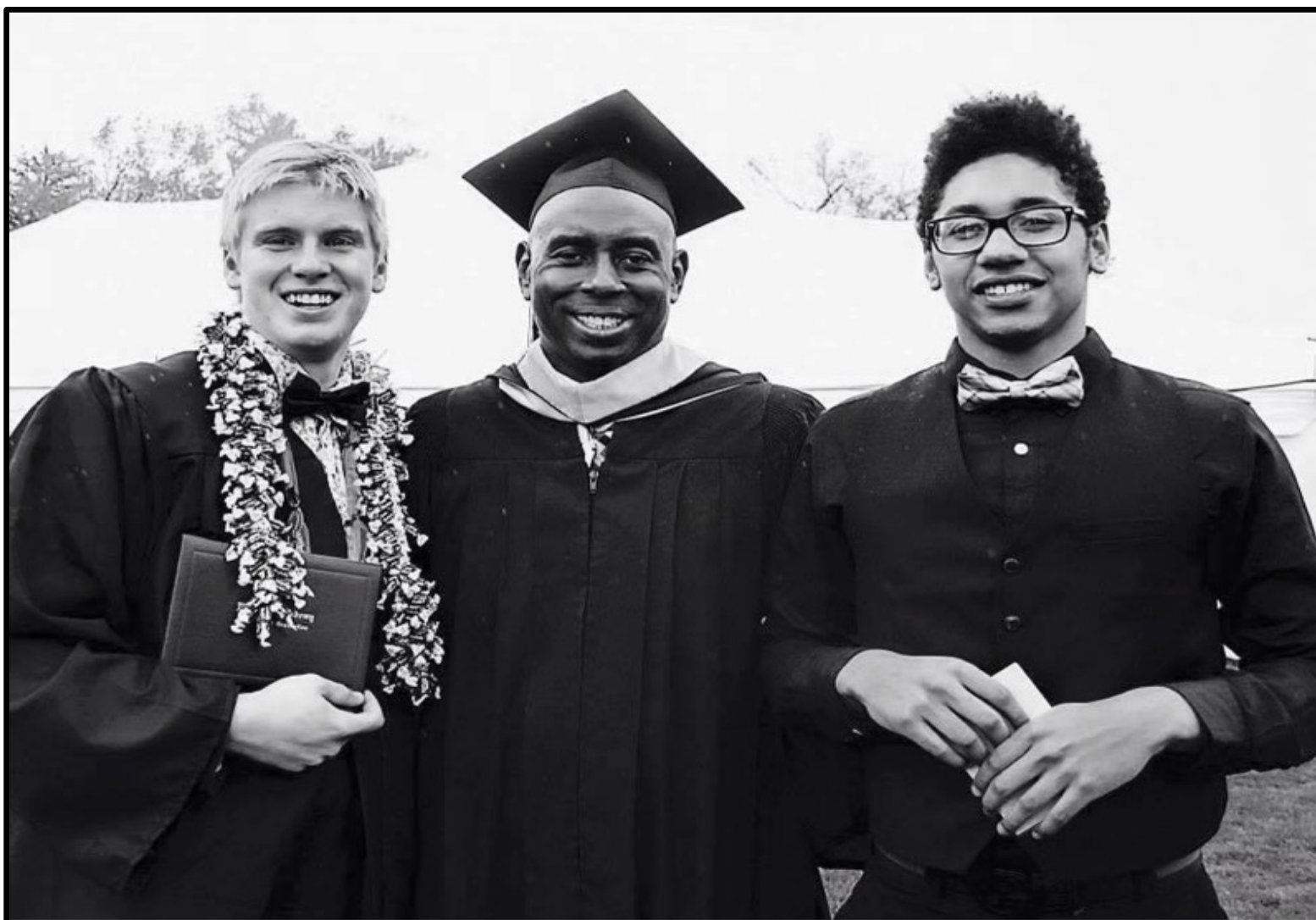


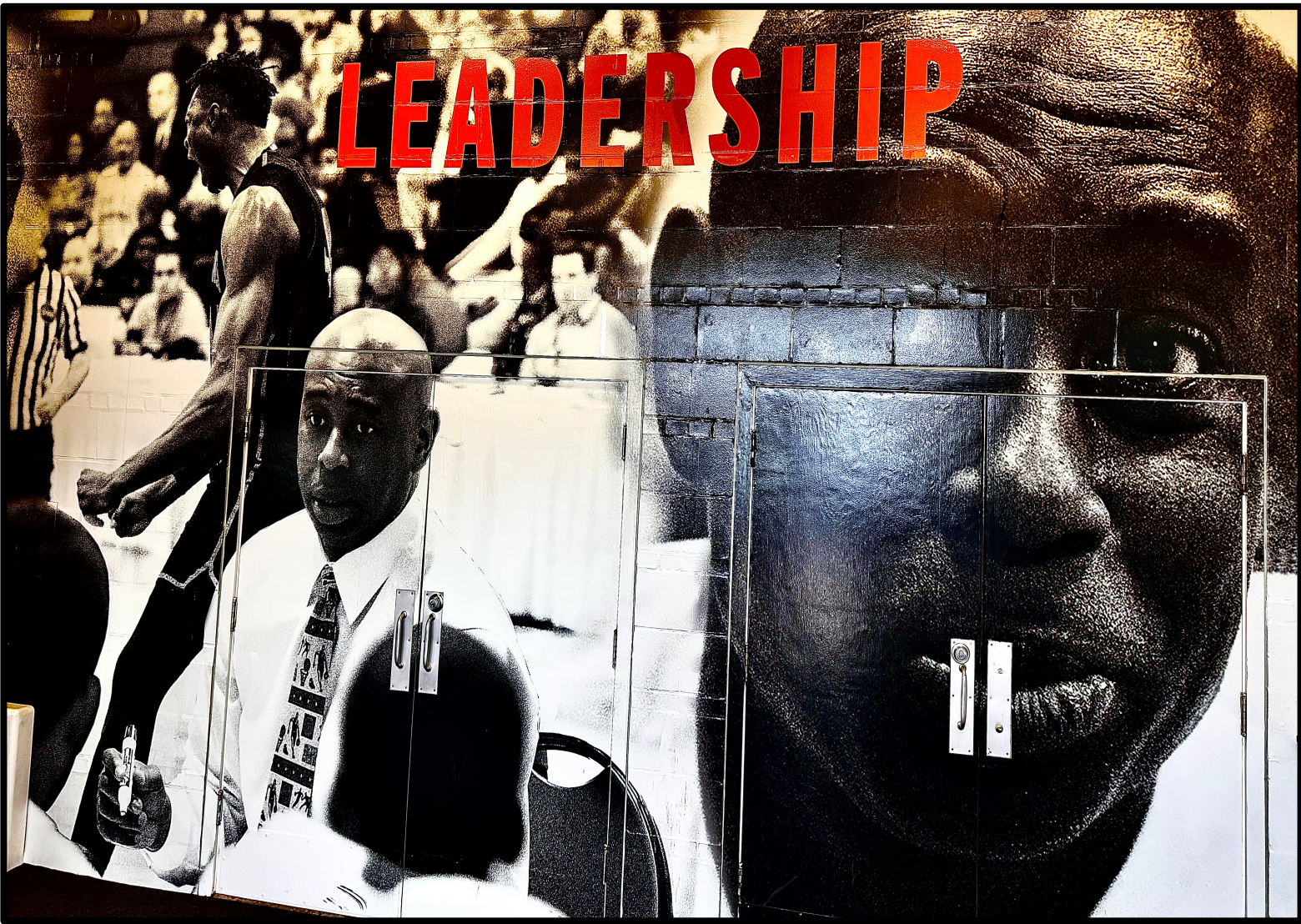

OUR INSPIRATION

Geno Morgan, March 31, 1966 - July 2, 2015, was a gentle giant with a powerful, infectious spirit and energy. He combined his passion for life with his gifts and talents to reach and teach young people throughout the country. While basketball was his sport of choice, Geno committed himself to coaching and mentoring all young people on and off the court with a reach that extended well behind athletics across multiple states.

OUR HISTORY

The Geno Morgan Foundation was inspired by the outpouring of stories and gratitude following Geno Morgan's passing in 2015. As the community reflected on his impact as a friend, coach, mentor, and teacher, it became clear that his influence extended far beyond the court. The Foundation was created to carry that legacy forward by investing in education and opportunity for underserved youth.

OUR MISSION

The Geno Morgan foundation is born of a desire to perpetuate the legacy of Geno Morgan. We do this through college scholarships targeted to advance higher education among underserved youth in communities and institutions uniquely impacted by Geno's dedication to young people realizing their full potential.

MESSAGE FROM OUR CHAIR

Dear friends,

2025 marked an important milestone for the Geno Morgan Foundation as we celebrated our 10th anniversary. This moment invited both reflection and renewed commitment—to Geno's legacy and to the young people whose lives continue to be shaped by his example.

Guided by that milestone, our theme for the year was to double our impact. We set out to expand what we give, how we engage, and the communities we reach. Through the dedication of our Board, donors, partners and volunteers, we doubled the total dollars committed to scholarships, strengthened the reach of our signature events, including our golf tournament and basketball activations, and deepened relationships with new donors and corporate partners who share our belief in the power of higher education and enduring legacy.

This year also brought powerful moments of reconnection. At our 9th Annual Geno Morgan Memorial Golf Tournament, we were joined by former Alaska Pacific University teammates who volunteered their time and committed to supporting the Foundation moving forward. We also returned to Wasatch Academy and visited Geno Morgan Court for the first time in many years. Seeing new inspirational murals, commemorative tributes and hearing former teammates and colleagues reflect on Geno's lasting influence on their lives reaffirmed that his impact continues to inspire well beyond his time on this earth.

One of the most meaningful moments of the year occurred at North Central Missouri College (formerly Trenton Junior College), where Board Member Louis Wilson and I were recognized as Distinguished Alumni—an honor made possible through the work of this Foundation. Reuniting with former coaches, teachers, teammates, and community members who remembered Geno from more than forty years ago was a powerful reminder of the lasting influence he had on so many lives. Their stories affirmed what we have always known: Geno's impact continues to echo across generations.

As Chair, I am deeply grateful to everyone who supports the Geno Morgan Foundation—through service, partnership, and generosity. Thanks to you, Geno's legacy continues with purpose and integrity. As we look ahead, we remain committed to expanding our reach and impact, investing in our youth, and ensuring that the confidence Geno instilled in others continues to open doors for years to come.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY

Guided by our mission to expand access to higher education for underserved youth, the Geno Morgan Foundation set an ambitious goal in 2025 to double our impact. This included increasing total scholarship award commitments from \$15,000 to \$30,000 and expanding the number of student recipients—an intentional investment in the students and communities we serve. Strong support from new corporate partners and individual donors helped drive revenue growth of 24% year over year, while expenses increased by 19% to support expanded programming. While the year reflects a planned operating loss associated with our expanded scholarship investment, GMF closed 2025 in a position of financial stability, reinforcing our commitment to responsible stewardship and sustainable growth.

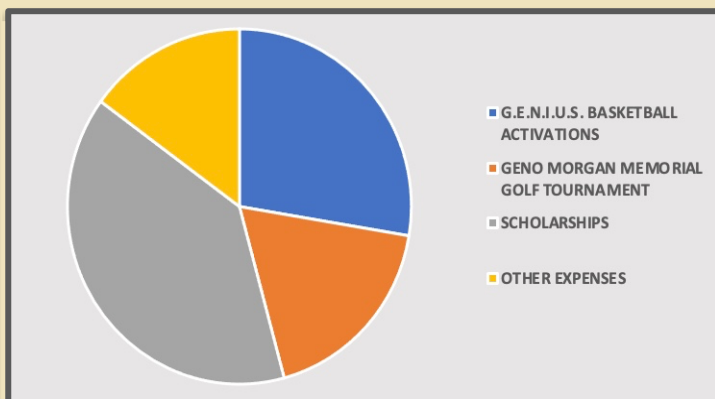
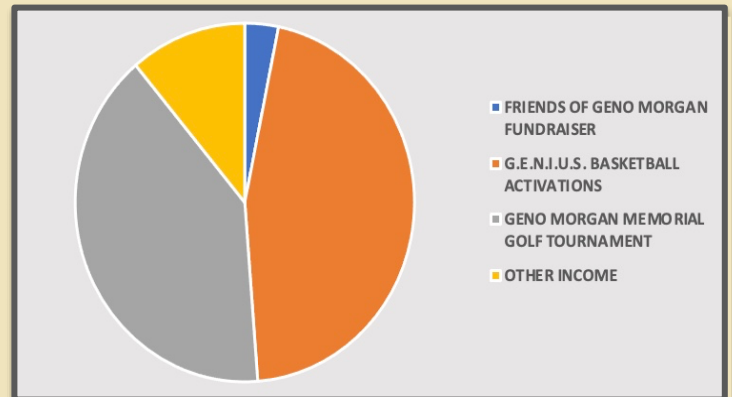
